Itinerary

Day 01 - Welcome to Sydney Kingsford Smith International Airport.

On arrival at Sydney Airport you will be transferred to your morning tour of Sydney see white sandy northern beaches and feel the sand between your toes, continue to pass by at Watson, Rose and Double Bay, stop to see the Gap – the cliff hanger of East Sydney, Kings Cross – the red light district during night time, view the famous Sydney Opera House and Harbour Bridge and then transfer to your fabulous luncheon cruise along the Harbour and check in.

Day 02 – Today we will start to visit those city churches and everyone should attend 1 hour mass in each church. We will visit the famous T Marys Cathedral which was the venue of the World Youth Day last 2000 Year which Pope Benedict attended. This Cathedral stands in the centre of Sydney as a Christian statement of grace beauty. Generations of artists have bequeathed to it their magnificent gifts in stone and glass, designing a unique space of solace and prayer within this vibrant city. Then follow to visit another Catholic Church – dedicated in 1844. This Catholic Church became the immediate focus of worship for Irish Catholics in the Colony. It has served the Catholic community of Sydney since then. Restored in 1999, this Catholic Church continues to be a spiritual oasis in a busy and vibrant city and remains one of the busiest Catholic City churches in Australia. Next we need to visit another Catholic Church is a Eucharistic shrine in the pastoral care of the Blessed Sacrament Congregation in the heart of the Sydney Chinatown. . And last but not least, this Catholic Church was the largest completed Pugin Church in Australia, it was sadly shortened and mutilated during reconstruction to allow for the widening of Broadway in the 1940's. The organ in this church is one of the finest and most important historic organs in Sydney. Built in 1882, it is the only organ known to have been constructed by F H Baker, a Sydney builder who acted on behalf of Alfred Hunter and Son of London. The instrument was given a full restoration by Pitch ford & Garside in 1978.

Day 03 – Next in our mission is to visit the famous local churches. We need to attend 1 hour mass in each church, to lessen our sins and make a sacrifice to our life. This Catholic Church is a Christ – centred Eucharistic community in which people of many cultures worship God and inspire each other to live the Gospel message. Next we need to attend mass to one of the famous Catholic church at which we can see the Grotto of our Lady of Lourdes after the mass. Next we visit the Australia first saint, from Mary Often troubled and humble beginnings in Melbourne to the establishment of a school in a stable in Penola, her early life showed her great desire to God's will and help those in need. This Catholic Church was opened in 1868. The organ Is dedicated to the memory of Raymond Hahn, the choir master and organist at St

Mary from 1888 to 1942, so the organ was evidently moved there from a previous, unknown location, sometime after his death. The organ was built in 1917 by the British Pinaforte Co with mechanical kit and stop action and tubular pneumatic pedal action.

Day 04 – It's time for us to sacrifice on this day at one of the famous and powerful and approximate 70,000 pilgrims visit their Shrine annually and in keeping with the tradition of

the Church, and the generosity of the pilgrims , we were able to crown their icon. This was the first time a Holy Image was crowned in Australia. The Crowns were blessed by Blessed Pope John Paul II, in Rome on 23 May 2001. The crowning ceremony took place in the shrine Church on 26 Aug 2001 during the Solemn Mass with the main celebrant being His Excellency Archbishop Francesco Canalini DD, with the assistance of his Lordship Peter Ingham, DD Bishop of Wollongong, State and Foreign government as well as other priests and religious. After our mass, we will unwind and visit those small chapels representing of different countries like St Mary MacKillop from Australia, St Anthony – from Maltese, St Stephen Chapel representing from Croatia, St Joseph Chapel – from Polish, Our Lady of the Way – from Italy, Ave Maria Chapel – from Spain, St Lorenzo Ruiz Chapel from the Philippines and a lot of more chapel. Then afterwards we will walk and visit the Our Lady of Lourdes in GROTTTO and at the same time, we will pray and kneel at Jesus' Tomb – which 1 person at a time is allowed to enter and pray.
